### **Statement of Accounting Policies**

#### 31 March 2014

### Accounting Convention

The accounts have been prepared in accordance with the Accounting Guidance Notes for Local Councils (the Guide) issued by The Chartered Institute of Public Finance and Accountancy (CIPFA) as applicable to a medium sized council. As a consequence the latest accounting policies, as set out in the Guide and so far as they apply to this council, have been adopted for the council's statements of account.

#### Fixed Assets

All expenditure on the acquisition, creation or enhancement of fixed assets is reported in the notes to the accounts, provided that the fixed asset yields benefits to the authority and the services it provides for a period of more than one year. Fixed assets are valued on the basis recommended by CIPFA. The year end values are stated on the following basis:

land, operational properties and other operational assets are reported in notes to the accounts at current insurance values as approximating to the lower of net current replacement cost and net realisable value infrastructure assets are included at historical cost, net of depreciation

certain community assets are the subject of restrictive covenants as to their; use and /or future disposal. Such assets are therefore considered to have no appreciable realisable value and are included at nominal value only.

### Grants or Contributions from Government or Related Bodies

Where a fixed asset has been acquired or improved with the financing either wholly or in part by a grant or contribution from government or a related body, e.g. Sports Council, the amount of the grant has been credited to Deferred Grants Account and carried forward. Grants so credited are released back to revenue over the life of the asset to match, and thereby offset wholly or in part, depreciation charged.

#### **Debtors and Creditors**

The revenue accounts of the council are maintained on an accruals basis in accordance with the guide. That is sums due to or from the council during the year are included whether or not the cash has actually been received or paid in the year. Exceptions to this are payment of insurance premiums and regular quarterly accounts (e.g. telephones, electricity). This policy is applied consistently each year. Therefore, it will not have a material effect on the year's accounts or on the council's annual budget.

### Stocks and Work in Progress

Bar stocks etc. held at the leisure and community centres are valued at cost. All other stocks have been treated as consumed because their value was not material.

#### **External Loan Repayments**

The council has no long term borrowing. Consequently, there were no external loan repayments made in the year.

#### Reserves

The council maintains certain reserves to meet general and specific future expenditure. The purpose of the council's reserves is explained in note 13.

### Interest Income

All interest receipts are credited initially to general funds.

### **Statement of Accounting Policies**

### 31 March 2014

#### Pensions

The pension costs that are charged to the council's accounts in respect of its employees are equal to the contributions paid to the funded pension scheme for these employees.

These contributions are determined by the fund's actuary on a triennial basis and are set to meet 100% of the liabilities of the pension fund, in accordance with relevant government regulations.

The next actuarial valuation is due at 31st March 2016 and any change in contribution rates as a result of that valuation will take effect from 1st April 2017.

# 5 General Power of Competence

With effect from 20<sup>th</sup> June 2013, Whitchurch Town Council acquired the right to exercise the General Power of Competence extended to Town and Parish Councils under the Localism Act 2011 S.I.2012 No 965 (The Parish Councils (General Power of Competence)(Prescribed Conditions) Order 2012). Therefore, with effect from 20<sup>th</sup> June 2013 the council no longer exercises the powers conveyed by Section 137 of the Local Government Act 1972 (as amended).

### 6 Pensions

For the year of account the council's contributions equal 19.10% of employees' pensionable pay, plus a lump sum of £1,900. These contributions will decrease/increase to 5.40%, plus a lump sum of £4,300, in future years which will provide adequately for known liabilities.
